HRHS Stewardship is demonstrating our “Faith In Action.”

“As each one of us has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God’s varied grace.” (1 Peter 4:10)

We want to see our school community of students use their gifts and talents to assist others without expecting payment in return. As part of our Faith program, we expect that Holy Rosary students are active in giving of their time, a minimum of ten hours per school year of Stewardship.

“A great attraction of stewardship, as I see it in action, is that it leads Catholic Christians to become more fully engaged in the whole of their life of faith, and so to become more able to fulfill their mission to the world. Each of us needs to realize, with wonder and gratitude, the precious gifts of God that we have received, beginning with the gift of life itself, so cheaply valued in our world of terrorism, abortion and social injustice.” (Archbishop Thomas Collins, Stewardship: Well done, good and faithful servant, December, 2004)

Places of Stewardship CAN be at:

- **School or church.**
- **Senior’s homes/complexes.**
- **Non-profit or charitable organizations.**

The following is NOT ACCEPTABLE as Stewardship:

- **Hours from a private business (ie: cleaning, clerical duties)**
- **Hours from a household activity (ie: cleaning, cutting grass, babysitting younger siblings... these are regular family duties).**

Think of Stewardship as something you would volunteer for.

- **Special circumstances with the elderly or urgent family matters may arise. Please discuss with teacher or administration prior to this situation.**

Stewardship hours are to be completed outside of school time unless otherwise designated by School Office personnel.
